CONSTITUTIONAL BY-LAWS**

Existing Provision in the Constitution	Proposed By-Laws	Rationale
<p><u>Article 24 – Board Tenure</u></p> <p><u>24.1</u> The term of office of Elected Board members shall be four (4) years. However, at the first election following the adoption of this Constitution, four (4) of the Elected Board Members will be elected for a four (4) year term and two (2) of the Elected Board Members with the lowest votes will be elected for a two (2) year term of office to allow for staggered terms of office for Elected Board Members.</p>	<p><u>Date of Implementation: 22 April 2024</u></p> <p>Should a situation arise where there is no lowest vote(s) due to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. No nomination received b. No contest <p>Then, the determination and decision on the term of office for the six (6) Elected Board shall be made at the first Board meeting after an Annual General Meeting (AGM) or through a Circular Resolution. That is,</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. A Four (4) year term for the uncontested positions for up to four (4) members. Should there be more than 4 (four), the President shall make the decision to select and name the other three (3) members plus the President, himself/herself. 2. A Two (2) year term for the remaining positions. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Even though the positions are not contested, these individuals have been nominated by their club for the position, thus they should have priority to be serving for the Association for a longer period. 2. The President, as the Chairperson at all General and Board meetings and who has the constitutional authority to represent SISA, to be given the mandate to decide on such matters.
